Communities of Interest Discussion and Public Input

Borderline Anaheim and Stanton: Lullaby Lane / major street Cerritos. Magnolia to Gilbert, Lullaby Lane to Ball Road. Homes constructed since early 1950s on southern/Lullaby Lane side, Salk Elementary, Magnolia High School, and some apartments on Ball Road. Square = community of interest. Families/residents there for a long time, 60-70 years. No specific name for the area.

District 3, bordered on east by I-5 freeway, west by Euclid, Lincoln to Ball north to south, wondered about a cutout (perhaps a population adjustment); not sure how far north, but new construction of residential on Lincoln east of Euclid coming

Question - does it consider future growth, like in the Platinum Triangle? (Bea) Answer: Yes, District 5 overpopulated due to growth since 2010. If know about future growth, can slightly under-populate an area while staying within 10% deviation.

If State College Blvd to the west goes into District 3 or 4 and then that makes District 5 smaller, which could work. Wondering if that would divide communities. (David Klawe) - Justin: the Platinum Triangle is on both sides of State College Blvd. Does that affect a community of interest? David - east is Angel Stadium and development of property. Is that separate from the rest of the Platinum Triangle or is it the same? Similar to Euclid as the border between Districts 2 and 3 - could State College work the same?

Part of District 5, what opportunities in Platinum Triangle are there? What are occupation levels? What is future growth potential?
